






ELLON AND DISTRICT STATISTICAL SUMMARY

Overall Vulnerability per Theme	MMW Summary
<p>Overall COVID Vulnerability Spectrum (Based on 2 major studies)</p> <p>Less Vulnerable  More Vulnerable</p> <p>42.1</p>	<p>Ward 9 – Ellon and District is one of the less vulnerable wards in Aberdeenshire. There is some geographic access deprivation due to longer drive times, bus accessibility scores and there is still a relatively high percentage of premises without superfast broadband (27.6%) however digital vulnerability is low. Health vulnerability is the category that is higher than the rest.</p>
<p>Overall Age Vulnerability Spectrum (Based on 2 indicators)</p> <p>Less Vulnerable  More Vulnerable</p> <p>31.6</p>	<p>Only IZ Ellon West has a high % of residents aged 65+ in this Ward which gives it a higher weighted rank percentage of 65+ pop relative to Total Population and 65+ pop receiving Attendance Allowance (AA). Taking into consideration both these indicators (the proportion of the population who are 65+ and have social care needs and are receiving Attendance Allowance) it decreases the overall age vulnerability of the Ward.</p>
<p>Overall Health Vulnerability Spectrum (Based on 28 indicators)</p> <p>Less Vulnerable  More Vulnerable</p> <p>26.3</p>	<p>In terms of health vulnerability Ward 9 is the 5th least vulnerable health wise in Aberdeenshire. To put it into context it has a value of 26.3 and Fraserburgh and District, 100. As of 31st July, there have been three COVID-19 deaths reported in the Ward – below the average in Aberdeenshire.</p>
<p>Overall Economic Vulnerability Spectrum (Based on 15 indicators)</p> <p>Less Vulnerable  More Vulnerable</p> <p>42.1</p>	<p>It has a higher median household income and an unemployment rate below the average (May 2020). There are differences within the Ward – The Loneliness Prescription Index for Intermediate Zone (IZ) Ythanside is the highest in Aberdeenshire at 68% but only 11.8% and 15.4 % in Ellon East and Ellon West respectively.</p>
<p>Overall Other Socio-Economic Vulnerability Spectrum (Based on 30 indicators)</p> <p>Less Vulnerable  More Vulnerable</p> <p>26.3</p>	<p>In economic terms, this Ward is average in terms of Aberdeenshire with various indicators above or near the average. The proportion of households earning less than £20,000, the income deprivation rate and the unemployment rate (May 2020) is below the average. Median household income is just above the average along with the child poverty rate. Pensioner poverty, and the proportion of people on Universal Credit suggests the area is at an average score for Aberdeenshire. reflected in some of the indicators on the next page.</p>
<p>100 = Most Vulnerable MMW in Aberdeenshire</p>	<p>The socio-economic vulnerability indicators rank Ward 9 as 15th highest. As seen on page 7, the percentage of single person households relative to total households is quite high at 30.4%, percentage of houses with private outdoor space is 92.1% and the Loneliness Prescription Index is high at 1.5 due in the main to the value for Ythanside.</p>

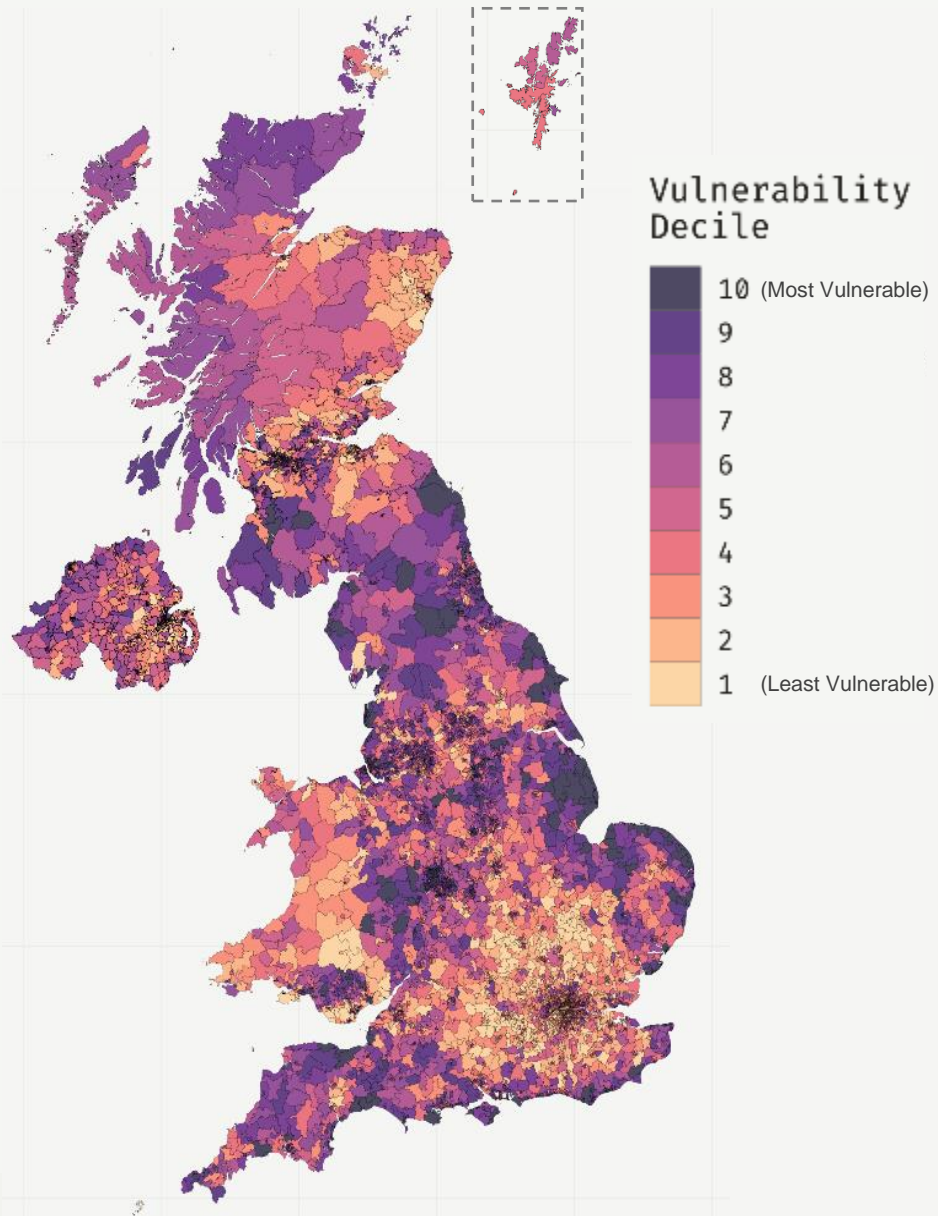

Multi-Member Ward Overall COVID Vulnerability Spectrum

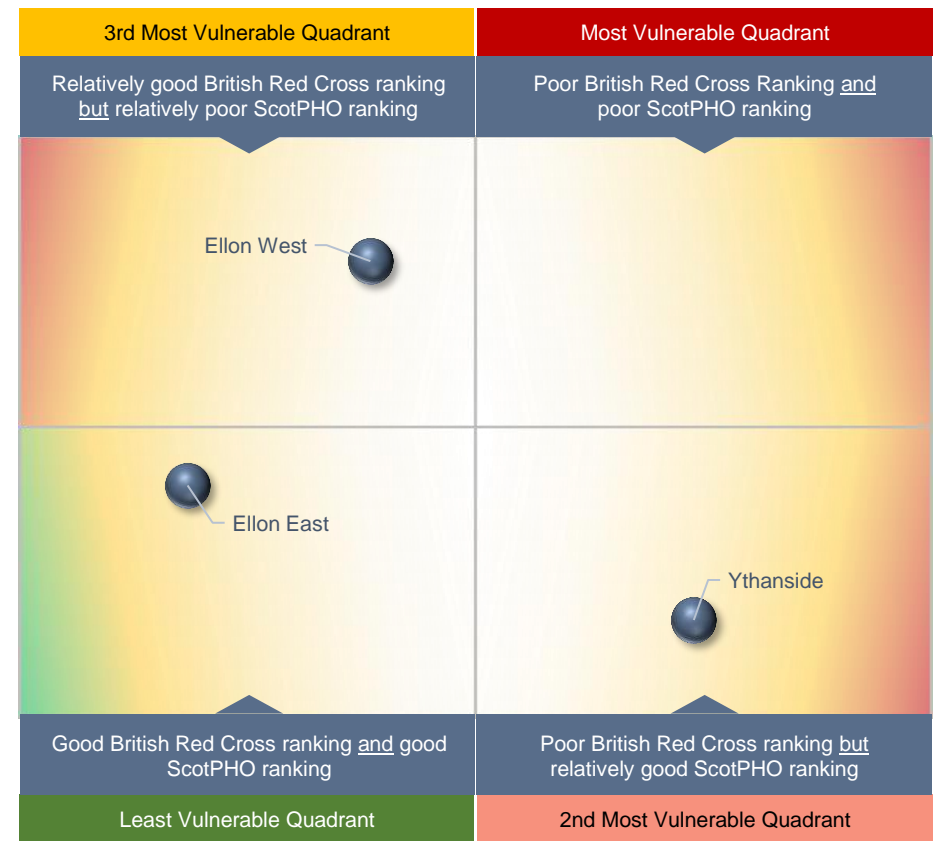

Summary

On the overall COVID Vulnerability Spectrum this Wards has below average vulnerability compared to others. The three IZs are all found in different quadrants- but none in the most vulnerable quadrant. Ellon East is the least vulnerable IZ and Ellon West the most vulnerable.

Ellon West has a higher % of residents aged 65+ than the other IZs.

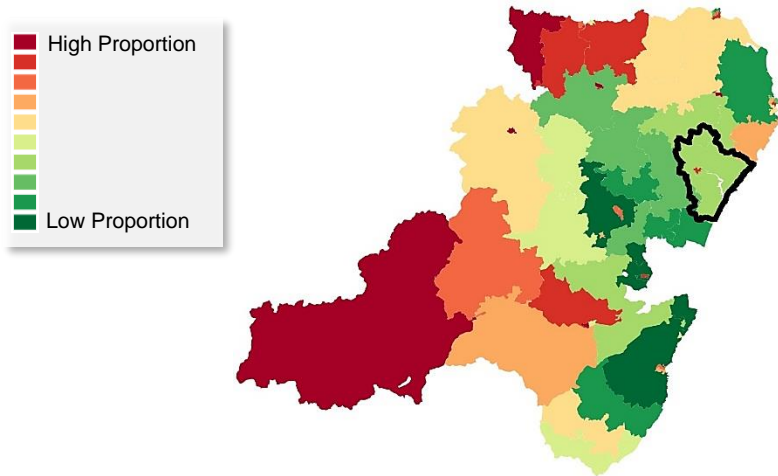

Multi-Member Ward Age Vulnerability Spectrum

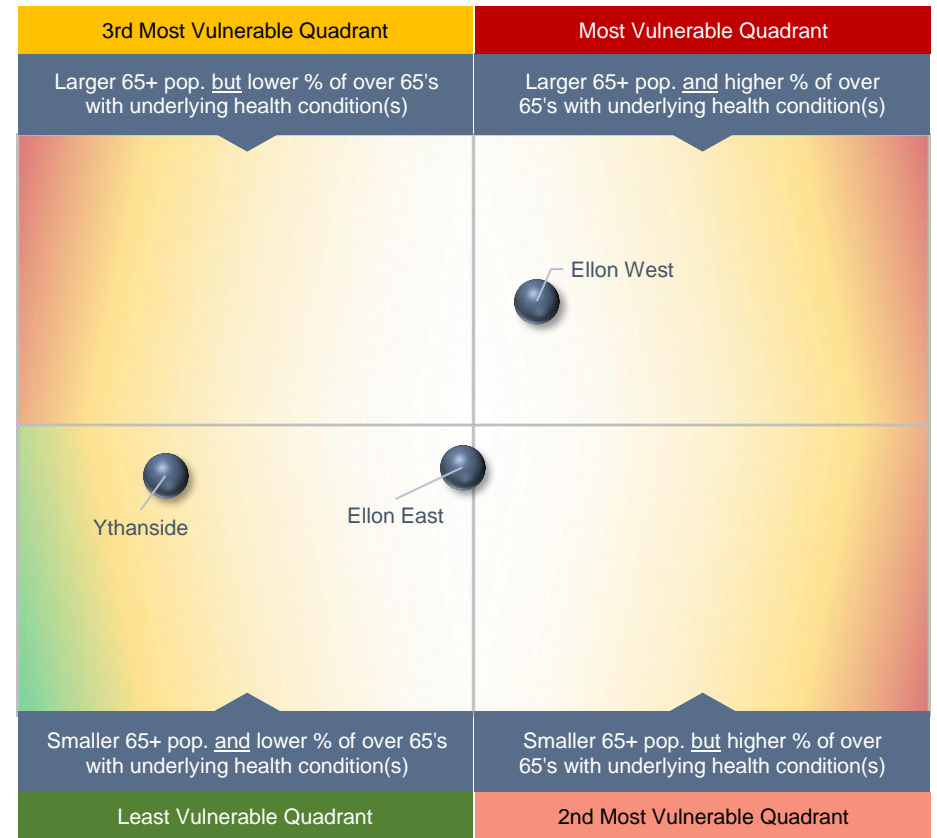

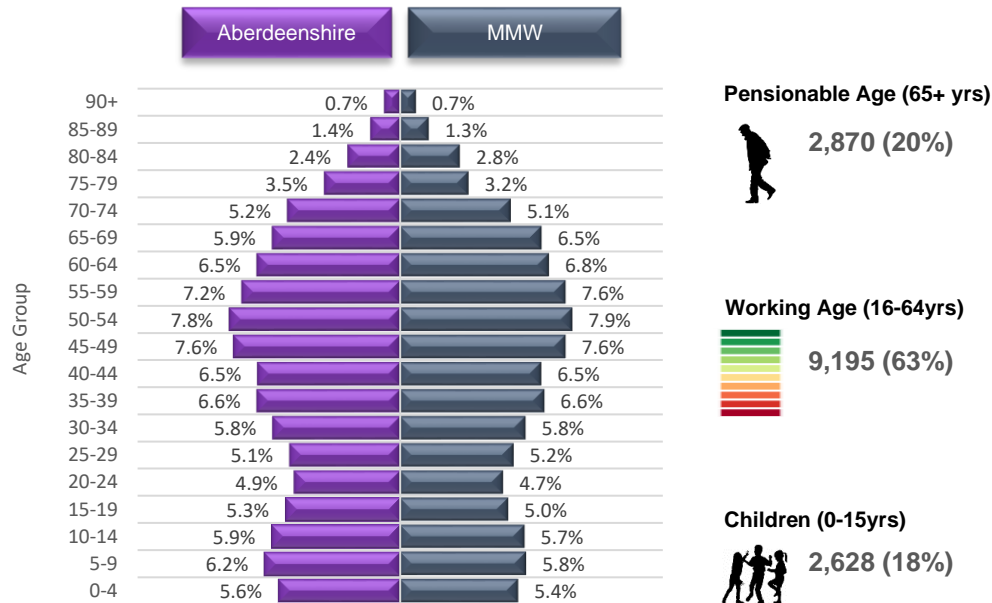
Map of Multi-Member Ward Intermediate Zones – 65+ population, 2018

Summary

The Intermediate Zone Ythanside is the second least vulnerable in Aberdeenshire, according to the age vulnerability indicators (3.8%) and the most vulnerable in Ward 9. Ellon East and Ellon West have 7.4% and 8.3% respectively proportion of people aged 65+ %. Across the Council area rates vary from 3.2% to 13.5%.

The % of those of pensionable age in Ellon West is 24.8% which is at the higher end of the scale, dropping to over 17% for the remaining two IZs. This is why Ellon West appears red on the map at the top left.

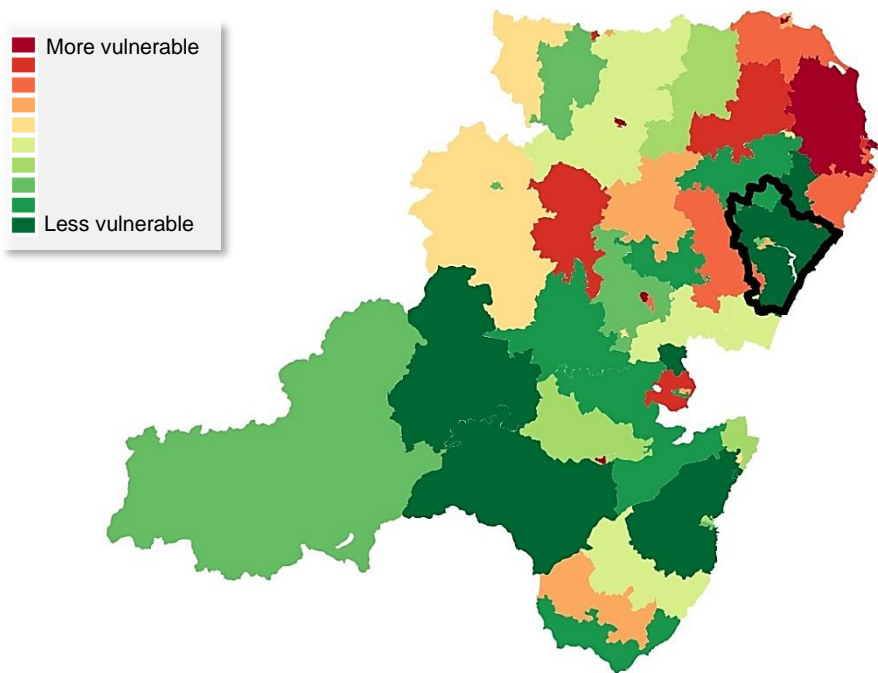

Multi-Member Ward Health Vulnerability Spectrum

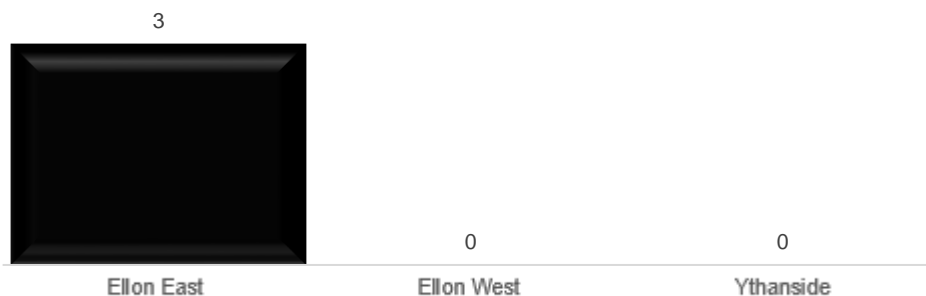
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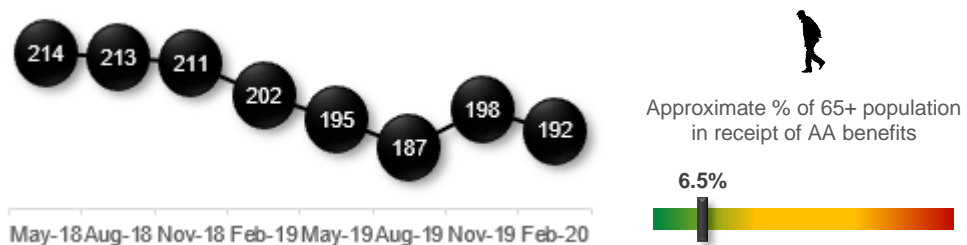
Map of Multi-Member Ward Intermediate Zones – Overall Health Ranking

Summary

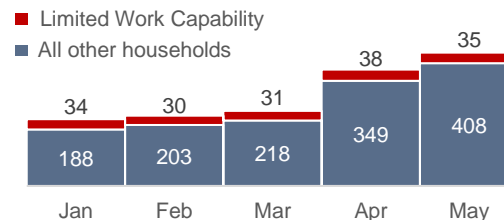
Most health-related indicators suggest the general population within the Ward is healthy. The proportion of the 65+ population receiving Attendance Allowance benefits is 6.5% - below the average for Aberdeenshire (8%) but at an IZ level Ellon West is 8.3%. The proportion of the working age population receive Personal Independence Payments (2.9% - among the lowest rates in Aberdeenshire).

Approximately 35 households in the area receive Universal Credit based on Limited Work Capability (due to physical or mental health issues). This equates to 7.9% of total households that receive Universal Credit Payments, which is below the average rate.

Ellon and District has recorded 3 COVID-related deaths so far, which is at the lower end. It is the reason that the IZ Ellon East shows as being the most vulnerable in the map of the Ward above.

No. of Households in receipt of Universal Credit (2020)

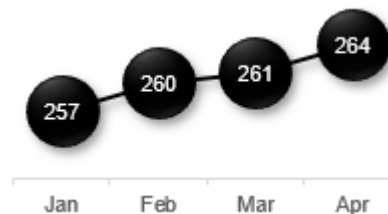


% of Households where at least 1 occupant has limited work capability

% of Working Age Population (16-64) Receiving PIPs

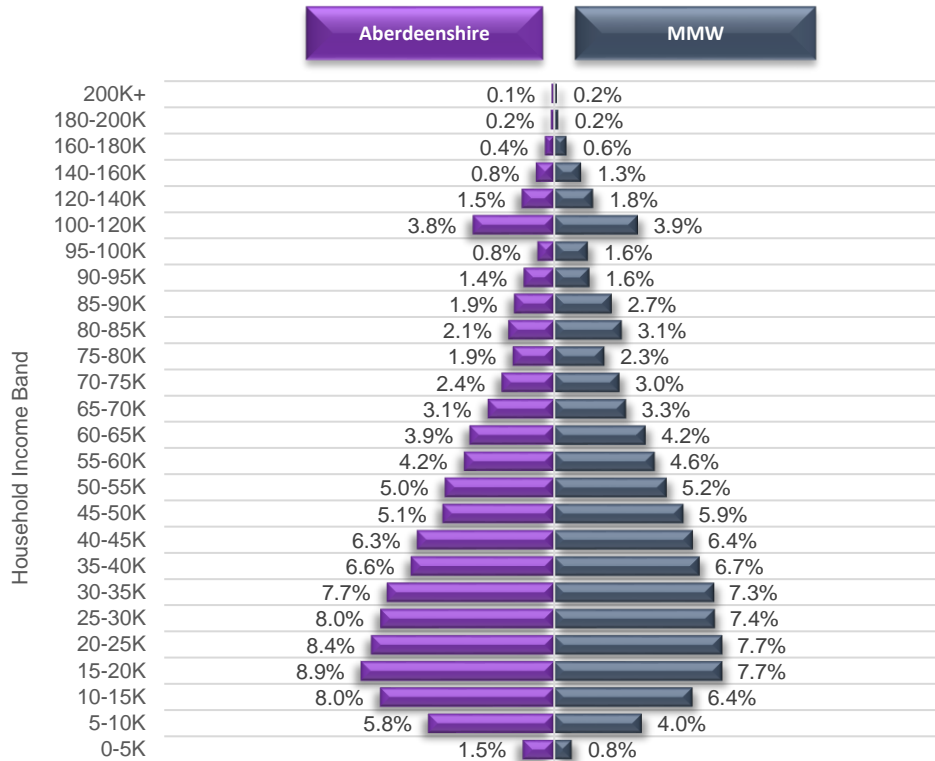

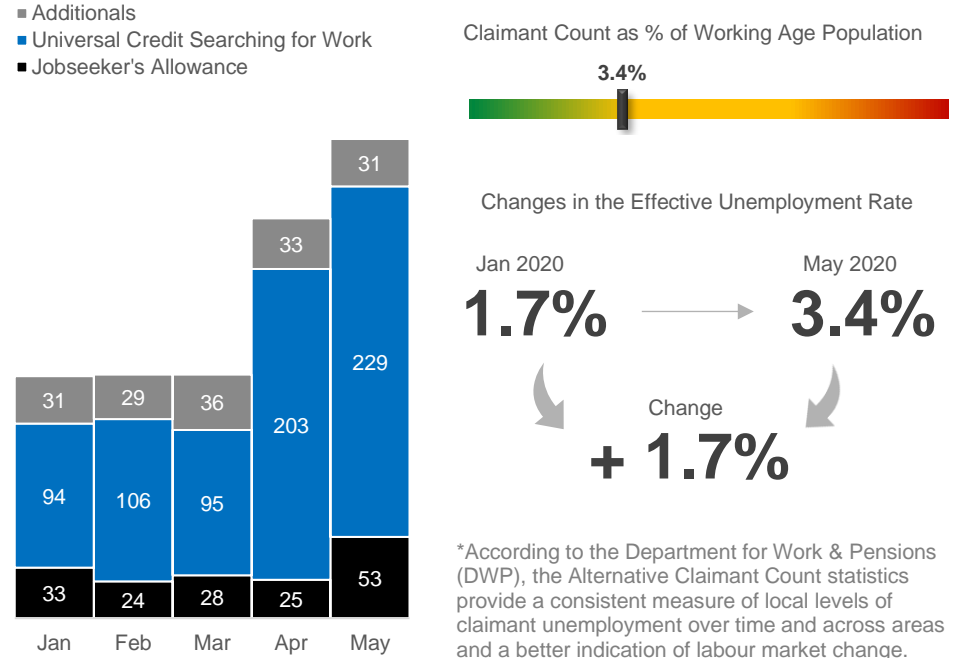


Median Household Income per Income Band - Percentage of Households (2019)

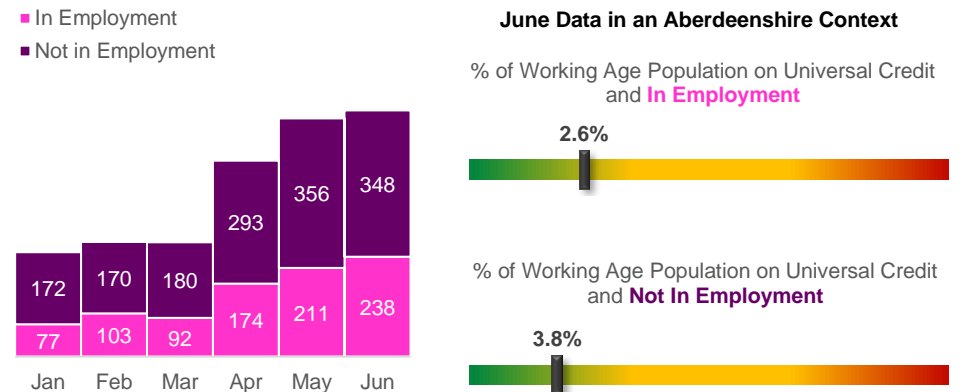


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Alternative Claimant Count* per Benefit Group - 'Unemployment Rate'(2020)

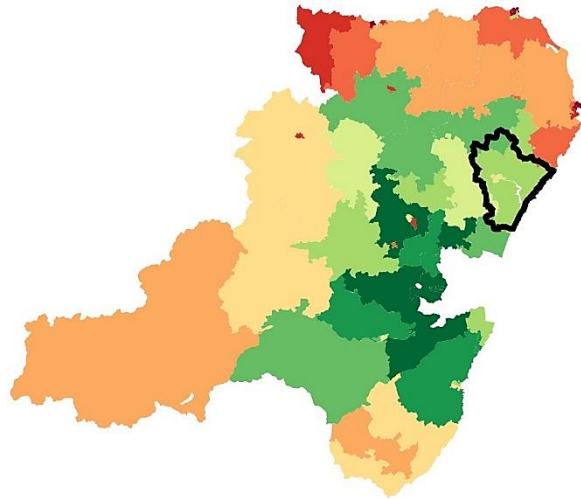
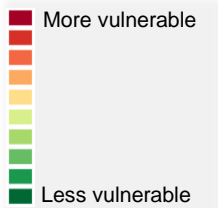

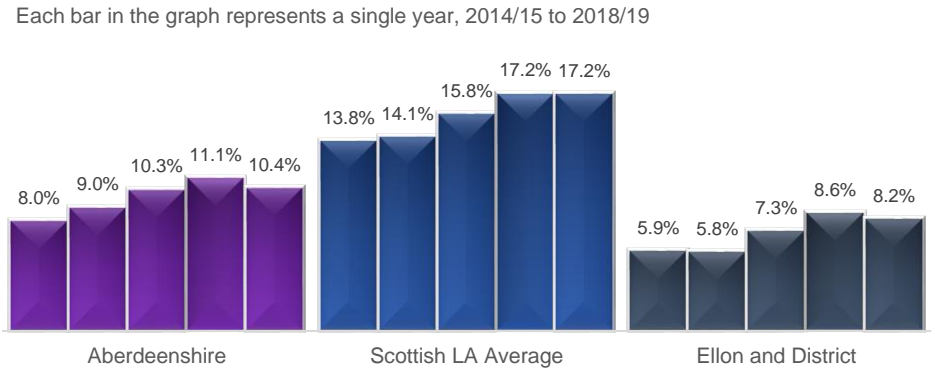

Pension Credit Benefits - Proxy Indicator for 'Pensioner Poverty' (February 2020)

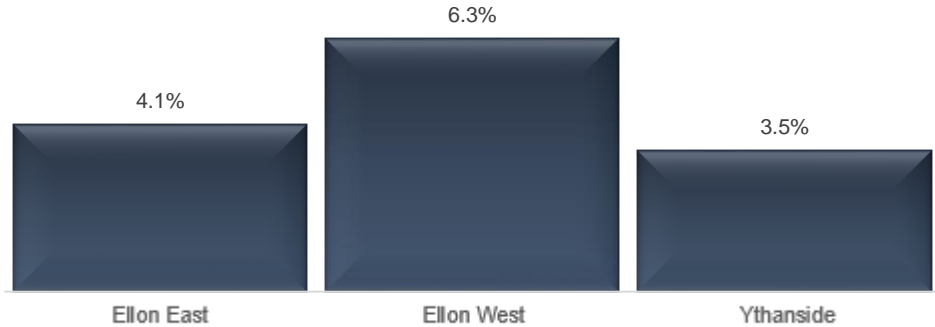

Summary

In economic terms, this Ward is average in terms of Aberdeenshire with various indicators above or near the Aberdeenshire average. The proportion of households earning less than £20,000 is below the average as is the income deprivation rate and the unemployment rate (May 2020). Median household income is just above the average along with the child poverty rate. Pensioner poverty, as defined above and the proportion of people on Universal Credit suggests the area is at an Aberdeenshire level.
