I am writing in support of the request of a Community Asset Transfer of the public conveniences in Lumsden to the Lumsden Community Association SCIO.

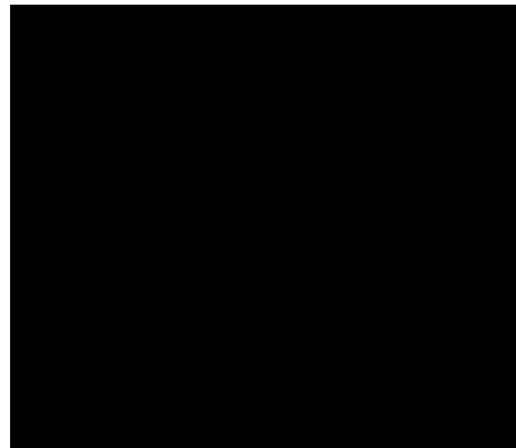
