









## **General Health / COVID Proxy Health Indicators**







Most pre-Covid health-related indicators suggest the general population within the Ward is relatively healthy. IZs associated with this Ward recorded 16 Covid-related deaths between March 1<sup>st</sup> and June 30<sup>th</sup> 2021, an increase of 9 deaths since the previous report (4 more in Durno-Chapel of Garioch, 2 more in Inverurie South, and 1 more in Kintore). Inverurie South is 1 of 14 IZs in Aberdeenshire to record zero deaths since the previous CIA report. (Aberdeenshire recorded a total of 253 COVID-related deaths between March 1<sup>st</sup> and June 30<sup>th</sup> 2021, an increase of 136 since the previous report.)


Covid deaths not withstanding, Inverurie South arguably has the worst overall health profile in the Ward based on a number of pre-Covid health-related indicators. Some of the more up-todate health-related indicators - for example, Households in receipt of Universal Credit with Limited Work Capability, and Personal Independence Payments (PIPs) - tend to reinforce this conclusion.

Indeed, benefits related to disability (PIP payments) are on the rise throughout the Ward and hundreds of additional households receive Universal Credit compared to at the beginning of the pandemic. However, the rate of PIP payments remains comparatively low in an Aberdeenshire





Attendance Allowance: Cases with Entitlement (Aged 65+ with Underlying Health Condition)


## Multi-Member Ward Economic Vulnerability Spectrum








People on Universal Credit - In Employment & Not in Employment (Jan 2020 to May 2021)
