BANFF & BUCHAN AREA PLAN 2020-23 – PROGRESS ON PROJECTS/ ACTIONS (2020 - 2023)

1 Executive Summary/Recommendations

1.1 To provide Banff & Buchan Area Committee with a mid-year update on progress made in relation to projects/actions within the Banff and Buchan Area Plan.

1.2 The Committee is recommended to:

- 1.2.1 acknowledge and consider progress made in relation to the projects/actions contained within the Banff & Buchan Area Plan which supports the Council Plan 2020-23;
- 1.2.2 instruct the Area Manager to continue to present progress reports to the Committee on a six-monthly basis, in line with the Performance Management Framework, evidencing progress and performance with delivery of the Council Plan 2020-23; and
- 1.2.3 note that the next Area Plan Performance and Progress Report is scheduled to be reported in November, 2022.

2 Decision-Making Route

- 2.1 The Banff & Buchan Area Plan 2020-23 was approved by the Banff and Buchan Area Committee at its meeting on 25 May 2021 and the associated Action Plan was subsequently updated.
- 2.2 The purpose of this report is to provide Committee with the first formal report on progress with projects/actions in line with the timescales set out in the Corporate Performance Framework.

3 Discussion

- 3.1 An update on the progress made with delivering the actions within the action plan aligned to the Area Plan is attached as Appendix 1 to this report.
- 3.2 Overall, positive progress is being made with all projects/actions detailed in the Area Plan, with several projects having been completed within the timescales.
- 3.3 Progress with a small number of projects is not as anticipated, and the update confirms any mitigation where appropriate. The main reason for

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actions being overdue has been the impact of Covid-19 on Service delivery.

3.4 The following table outlines the number of projects within each category:

On 28 September 2021, the Area Committee approved the Area Performance Framework (Item 14 refers) and associated performance indicators, proposed by Services, which will further enable the scrutiny of progress of both the Area Plan and "business as usual" activity. Committee agreed to receive separate performance reports for each Directorate. The agenda for today's meeting contains update reports from each of the three Directorates. Further Performance reports will be received from the Directorates in December 2022. Informal sessions with the Directors will be scheduled in the alternate quarters to the formal reports.

- This, and future, performance monitoring reports are provided to assure and enable the Committee to monitor progress of delivery of the Council priorities within the Banff & Buchan area, providing a balanced overview allowing Elected Members to form a judgement on performance and support improvement as required in line with the scrutiny remit of the Committee.
- 3.6 Progress against local Health & Social Care Partnership (HSCP) activities has been impacted by the continuing effects of the Covid-19 pandemic and other increased demands on the health and social care system locally. As demands return to more manageable levels, updates from the HSCP will be included in future reports.
- 3.7 The Services are responsible for updating the notes relating to the actions in the Pentana system. Elected Members do have access to Pentana and can view the actions in the Area Plan and raise queries with the Services outwith the formal reporting process. Training on Pentana was provided early in 2022 and is now available in a recorded format.

4 Council Priorities, Implications and Risk

4.1 This report supports the delivery of the three Pillars, the six Strategic Priorities and the key principles; right people, right place, right time; responsible finances; climate and sustainability; Community Planning Partnership - Plans; human rights and public protection; tackling poverty and inequalities; digital infrastructure and economy.
