






INVERURIE AND DISTRICT STATISTICAL SUMMARY

Overall Vulnerability per Theme	MMW Summary
<p>Overall COVID Vulnerability Spectrum (Based on 2 major studies)</p> <p>21.1</p> <p>Less Vulnerable  More Vulnerable</p>	<p>Ward 11– Inverurie and District is one of the less overall COVID vulnerable wards. Economic and Health factors and to some extent Age are the main causes of the COVID Vulnerability.</p>
<p>Overall Age Vulnerability Spectrum (Based on 2 indicators)</p> <p>42.1</p> <p>Less Vulnerable  More Vulnerable</p>	<p>Only two of the Intermediate Zones (IZ) have a higher than average percentage of residents 65+ relative to Attendance Allowance (AA) cases with entitlement which gives it a higher weighted rank percentage of 65+ pop relative to Total Population and 65+ pop receiving AA. Taking into consideration both these indicators (the proportion of the population who are 65+ and have social care needs and are receiving AA) it increases the overall age vulnerability of the Ward slightly.</p>
<p>Overall Health Vulnerability Spectrum (Based on 28 indicators)</p> <p>73.7</p> <p>Less Vulnerable  More Vulnerable</p>	<p>In terms of Health vulnerability Ward 11 is the 6th most vulnerable ward health wise in Aberdeenshire. To put it into context it has a value of 73.7, East Garioch 21.1, West Garioch 42.1 and Westhill and District 57.9. As of 31st July, there have been nine COVID deaths reported in the Ward – above the Aberdeenshire average (8) resulting in an increase in the Health vulnerability.</p>
<p>Overall Economic Vulnerability Spectrum (Based on 15 indicators)</p> <p>52.6</p> <p>Less Vulnerable  More Vulnerable</p>	<p>Ward 11 is ranked just above average when looking at economic vulnerability in Aberdeenshire. There are some differences across the Ward. Durno-Chapel of Garioch (£51,525) and Kintore (£46,991) IZs have high average median incomes whilst Inverurie North (£36,576) is in the bottom 40% and Inverurie South (£29,817) in the bottom 30%. the other two IZs are among the bottom 40% in Aberdeenshire.</p>
<p>Overall Other Socio-Economic Vulnerability Spectrum (Based on 30 indicators)</p> <p>15.8</p> <p>Less Vulnerable  More Vulnerable</p>	<p>The Socio-economic Vulnerability in Ward 11 is the 3rd least vulnerable. As seen on page 7, across the Ward the average % of households without a car or van is 10.2% - quite low compared with other areas however access to own transport is often higher in more rural areas. Around 18.1% of premises are without access to superfast broadband but overall digital vulnerability is very low. The percentage of single person households relative to total households is above the Aberdeenshire average at 32.1%. The percentage of 16+ population in receipt of Housing Benefit is average compared with other Wards. Three of the four wards in The Garioch Area are in the top 3 least vulnerable with West Garioch in 8th position.</p>

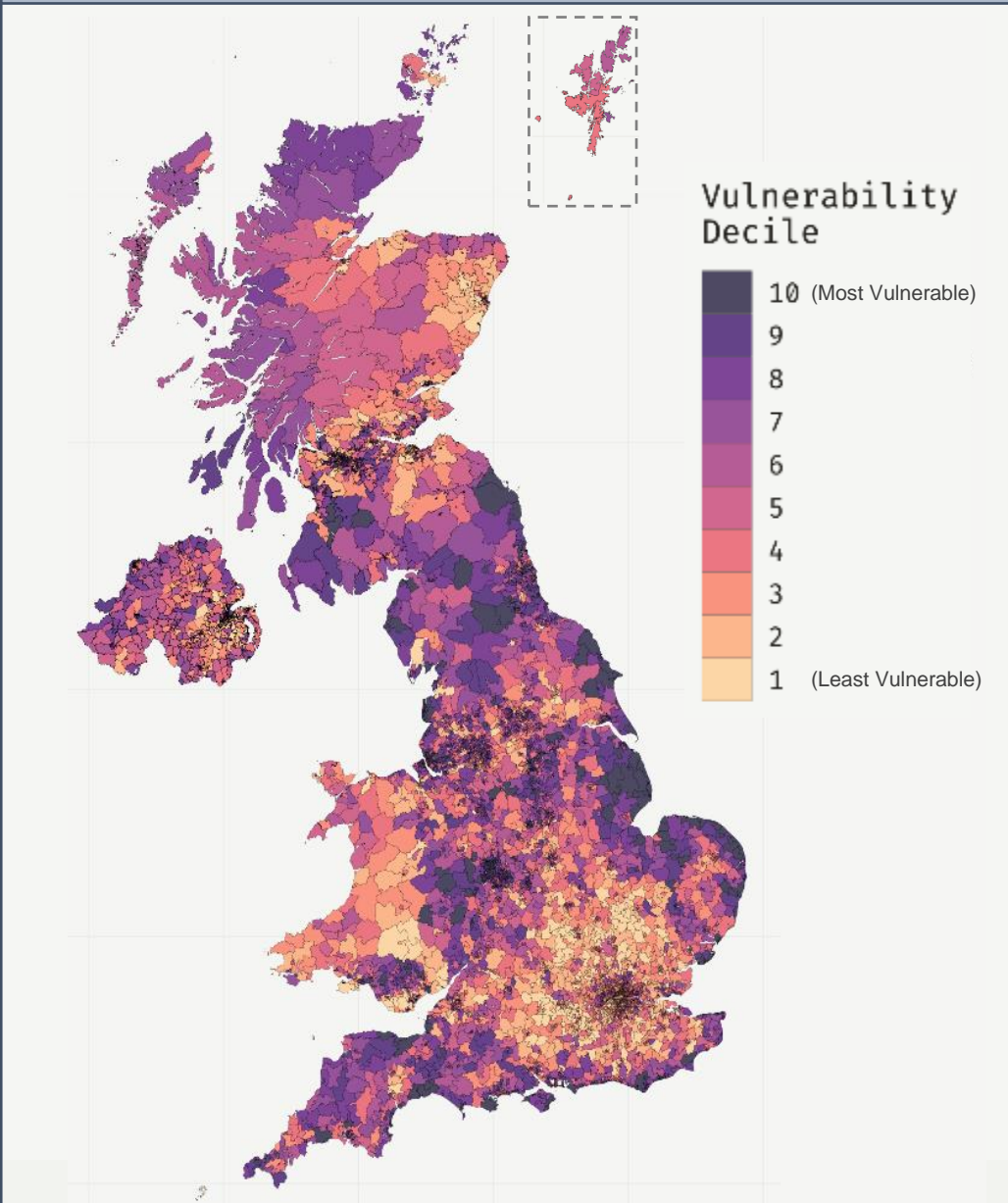

Multi-Member Ward Overall COVID Vulnerability Spectrum

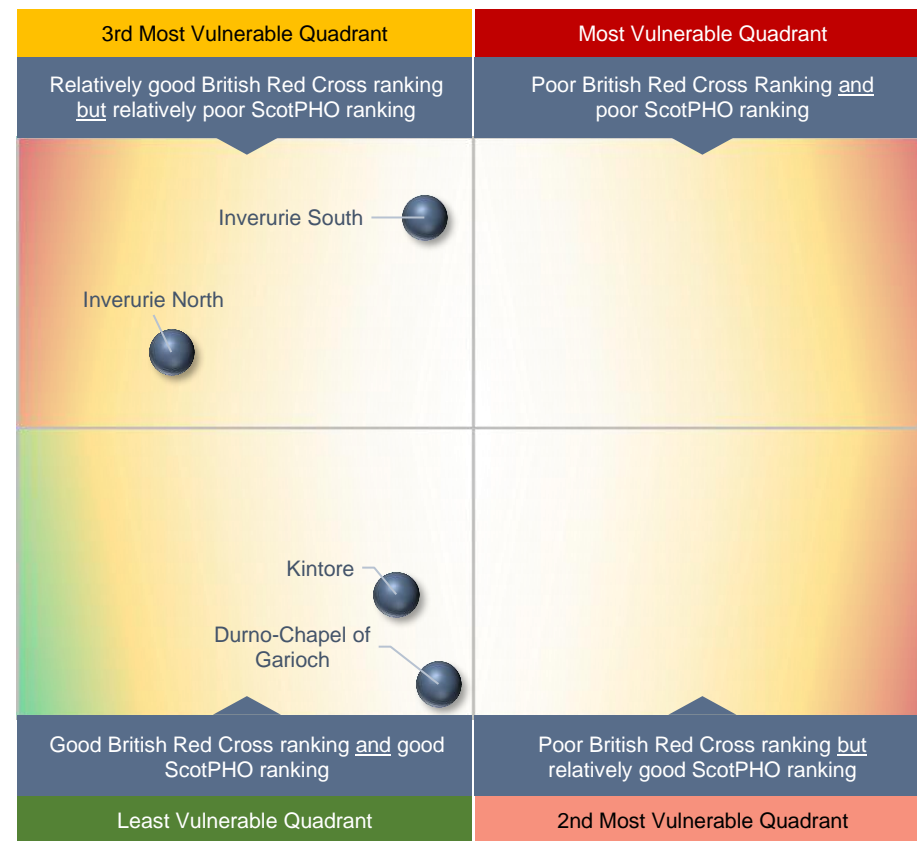

On the Covid Vulnerability spectrum Inverurie South is the most vulnerable IZ and along with Inverurie North has a higher % residents aged 65+. Durno-Chapel of Garioch is the least vulnerable IZ and has a much lower % of residents aged 65+.

Inverurie and District is the fourth least vulnerable Ward in Aberdeenshire.

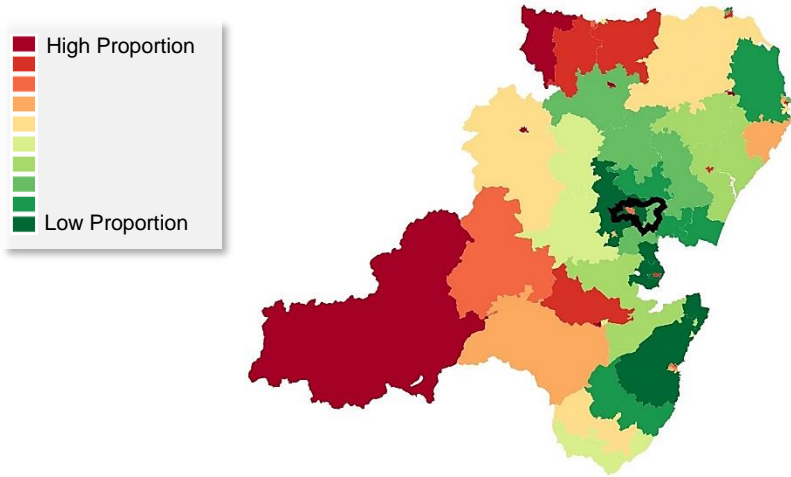

Multi-Member Ward Age Vulnerability Spectrum

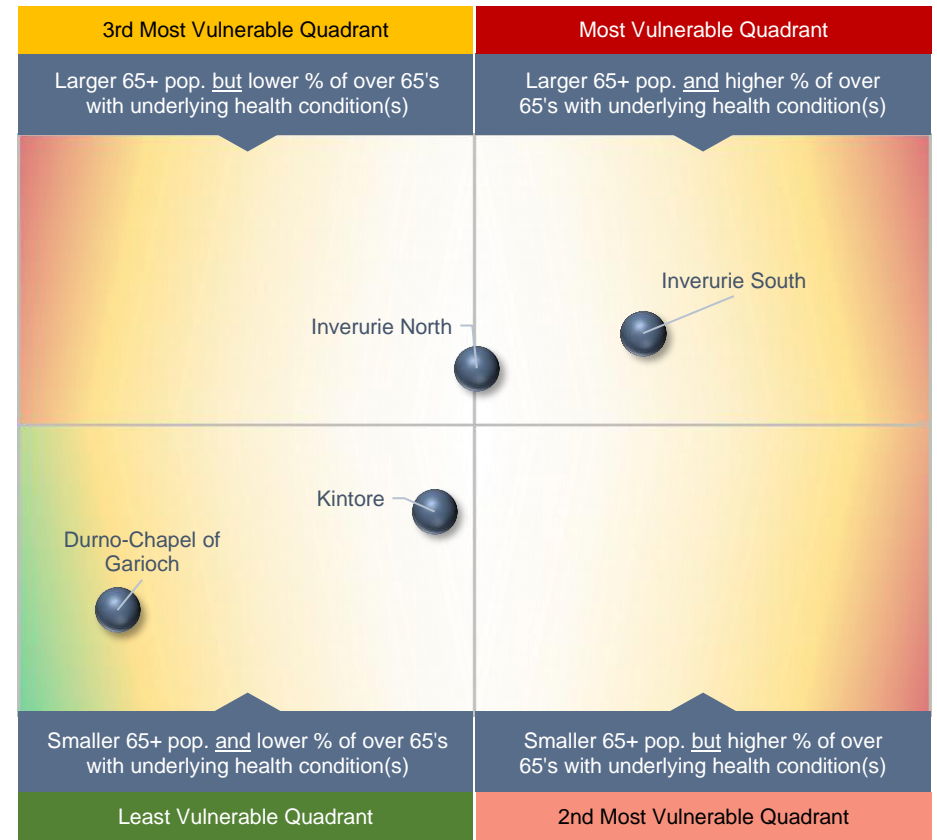

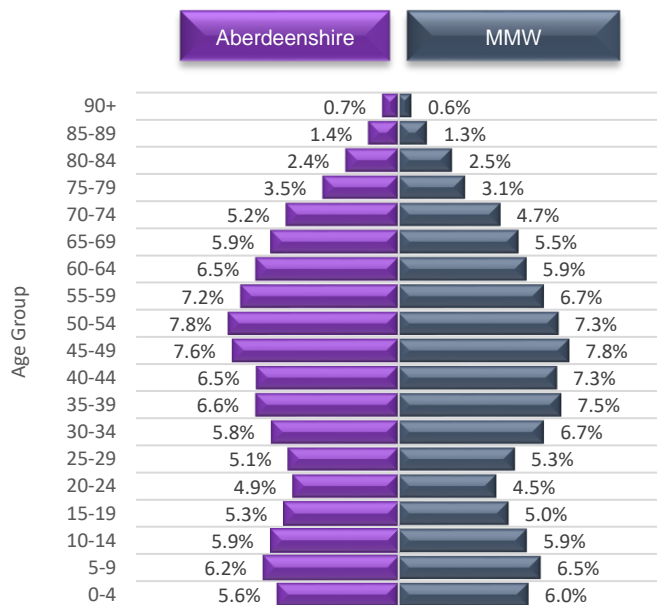
Map of Multi-Member Ward Intermediate Zones – 65+ population, 2018

Summary

The Intermediate Zones within this Ward are spread across the quadrants with Inverurie South among the most vulnerable in Aberdeenshire, according to the age vulnerability indicators. Durno-Chapel of Garioch is the least vulnerable with one of the lowest % of 65+ population relative to Attendance Allowance cases with Entitlement (3.8%) in Aberdeenshire

Rates range from 3.2% in Durno-Chapel of Garioch (below the Aberdeenshire average 8.2%) to Inverurie South with the highest percentage (9.5%). Across the Council area rates vary from 3.2% to 13.5%.

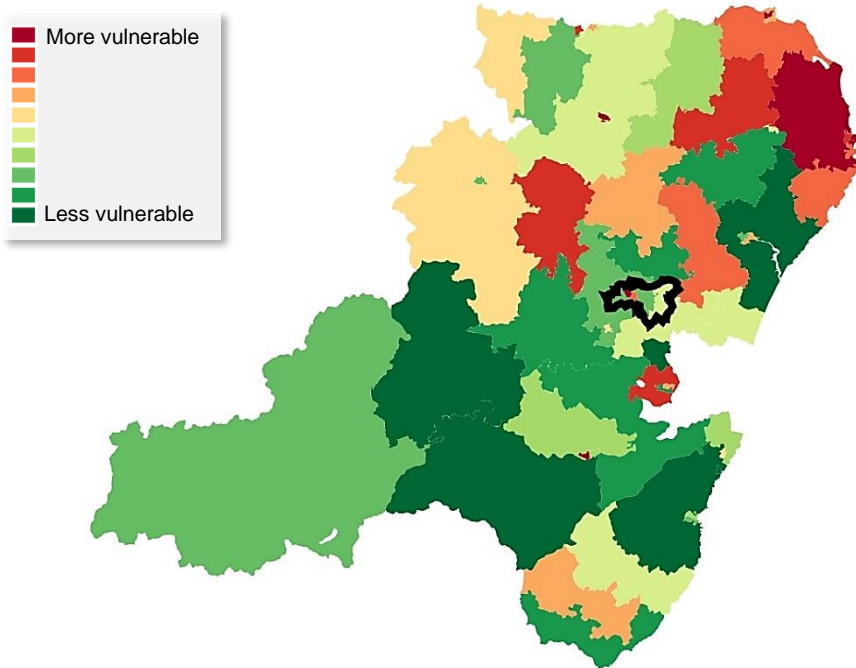
Multi-Member Ward Health Vulnerability Spectrum

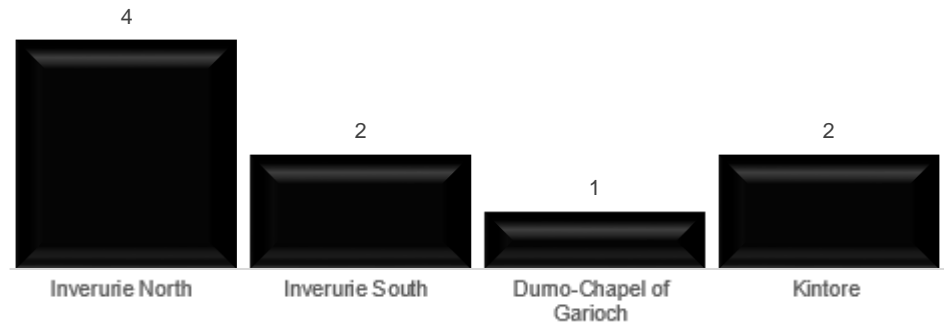
Cumulative COVID-19 Deaths (1st March 2020 to 31st July 2020) Inverurie North 4,



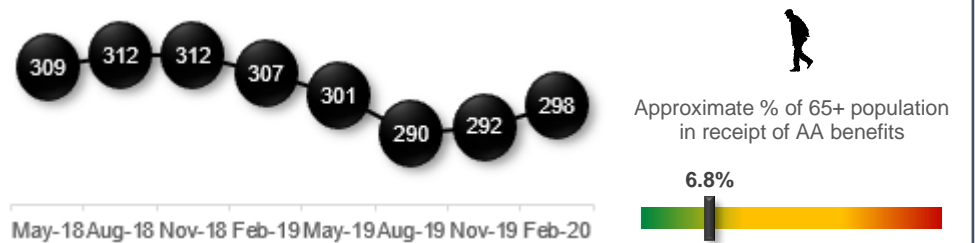
Map of Multi-Member Ward Intermediate Zones – Overall Health Ranking

Summary

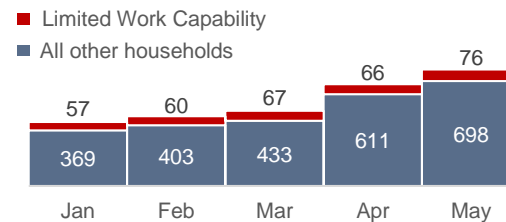
Most health-related indicators suggest the general population within the Ward is relatively healthy. A relatively small proportion of the 65+ population receive Attendance Allowance benefits (6.8% - the lowest proportion for a Ward in Aberdeenshire), and a small proportion of the working age population receive Personal Independence Payments (3.5% - among the lowest rates in Aberdeenshire).

Approximately 76 households in the area receive Universal Credit based on Limited Work Capability (due to physical or mental health issues). This equates to 9.8% of total households that receive Universal Credit Payments, which is just below the average rate.

Inverurie and District has recorded 9 COVID-related deaths so far, just above the Aberdeenshire average. It is for this reason that the Ward scores poorly in relation to the Health theme relative to most other themes in this report. The location of a care home or other institutional setting may have effected this outcome.

No. of Households in receipt of Universal Credit (2020)

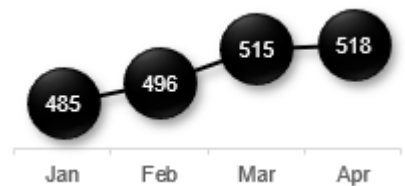


% of Households where at least 1 occupant has limited work capability

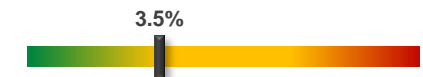


Personal Independence Payments (PIP)

% of Working Age Population (16-64) Receiving PIPs



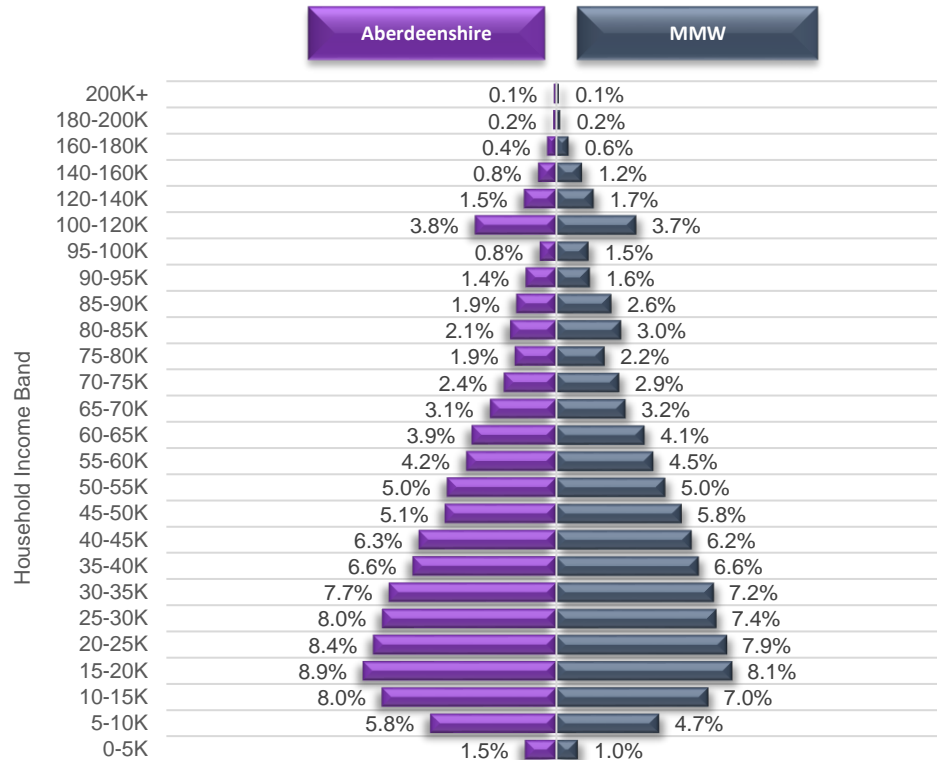

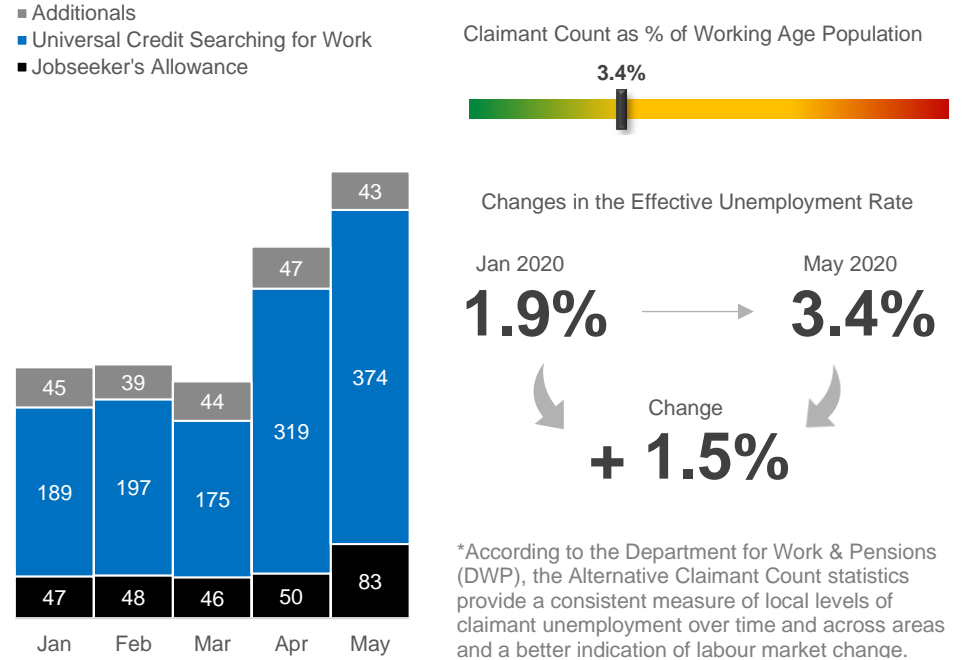


Median Household Income per Income Band - Percentage of Households (2019)

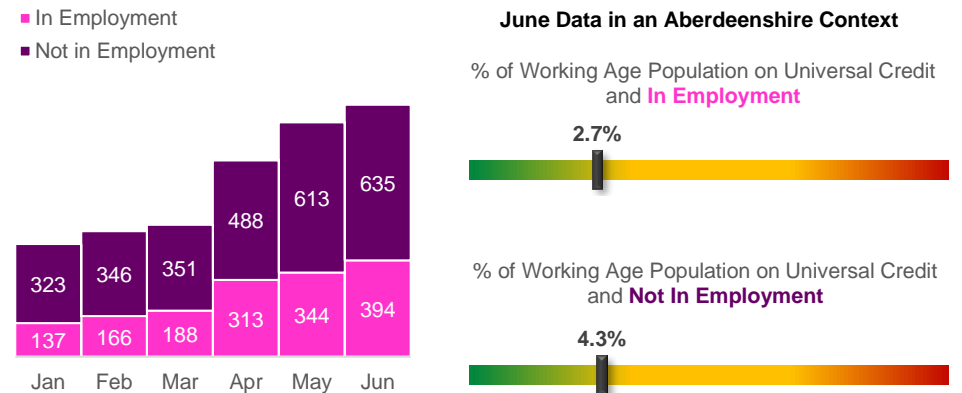


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Alternative Claimant Count* per Benefit Group - 'Unemployment Rate'(2020)

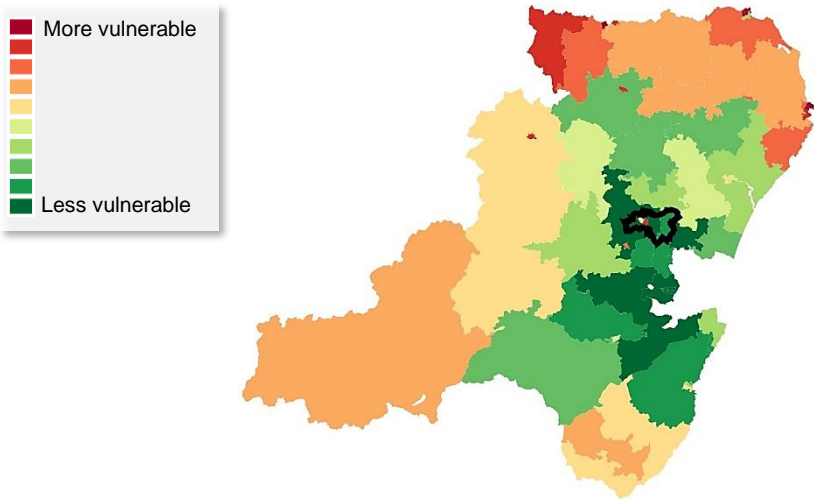

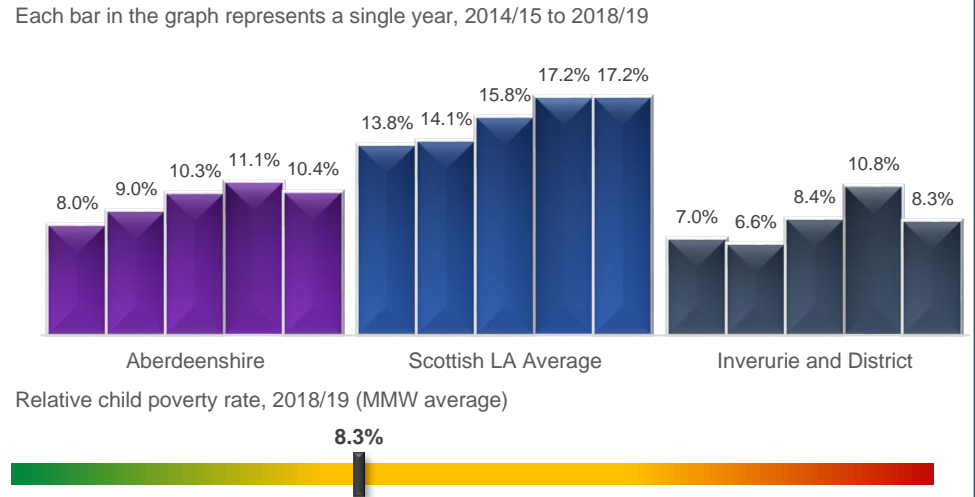

Map of Multi-Member Ward Intermediate Zones - Overall Economic Ranking



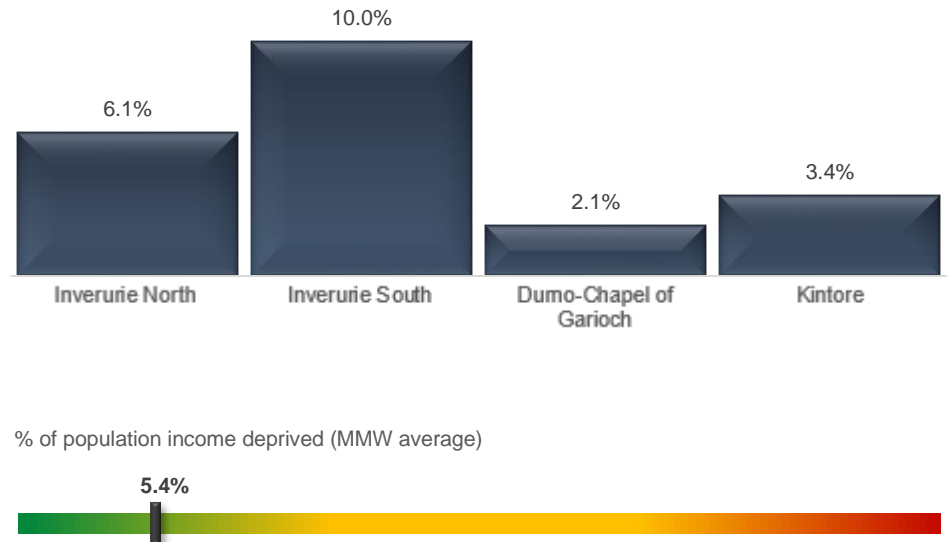
Percentage of Children in Low Income Families (Relative Poverty), 2014/15 to 2018/19

Summary

In economic terms, this Ward is just above average in terms of Aberdeenshire with various indicators at or above the Aberdeenshire average. The proportion of households earning less than £20,000 is below the average as is the income deprivation rate and the unemployment rate (May 2020). Median household income is just above the average along with the child poverty rate in Inverurie and District. Pensioner poverty, as defined above and the proportion of people on Universal Credit add weight to the ranking for Aberdeenshire.


































This is to some extent reflected in the indicators on the next page. Under Housing/Environment there are two indicators - % single person households relative to total households and % of addresses with outdoor space which lowers the socio-economic vulnerability. A potential vulnerability exists, however, in relation to the proportion of jobs in retail (12.4% of jobs are categorised as such, among the higher proportions in Aberdeenshire).
